

<p style="text-align: center;">Conditions Applicable to the Catholic Foundation of the Archdiocese of Wellington Tertiary Study Scholarship Awards - 2008</p>

- 1. Catholic Foundation Scholarship applications are available to Year 13 students (or Year 12 students in their final year of secondary schooling) attending a Catholic College in the Wellington Archdiocese. Also eligible to apply are Catholic students who, because of the absence of a Catholic secondary school in their area, attend a local State secondary school or Correspondence School. The geographical area in question roughly covers from the boundaries of the South Island parishes of Kaikoura, Reefton, and Westport to Levin and Masterton in the North Island.**
- 2. With the written endorsement of the College Principal/Rector and the Dean of Senior Studies, each Catholic College is entitled to nominate up to 3 students for a Catholic Foundation scholarship.**
- 3. In circumstances where a particular student/s has been obliged to attend a State secondary school or Correspondence School for the reasons stated above, a Parish Priest may nominate up to 2 students from his own parish for a Catholic Foundation Scholarship**
- 4. Each successful scholarship recipient will receive a one-year scholarship of \$2000 towards the cost of full time study for a Degree/Diploma/Certificate course at a New Zealand University or Polytechnic Institute. Each scholarship will be paid as a lump sum upon the presentation of relevant and supportive tertiary enrolment documentation for the 2009 academic study year.**
- 5. The Catholic Foundation Scholarships Selection Committee will consider the all-round qualities of each applicant, not simply academic achievement, together with the potential contribution that he/she may make to the well being of the Church (and New Zealand society) in determining the awards. The decision of the Foundation Scholarships Selection Committee is final and no appeal on decisions made will be entered into.**
- 6. The Foundation Scholarships Selection Committee will select a short-list of candidates who will be called for a personal interview at the Catholic Centre in Wellington. The selection of candidates will be a matter of the Committee's judgement and will be based on the perceived quality of each scholarship application. The scholarship interviews are planned for late October 2008 with the award of the scholarships to be made in November 2008 (date/s to be finalised in due course). All applicants (and the College/School Principal and, where applicable the Parish Priest) will be notified in writing as to the outcome of their scholarship application.**

7. The Catholic Foundation of the Archdiocese of Wellington reserves the right to publicise the name and photograph of each scholarship recipient in the Archdiocesan monthly newspaper, 'Wel-Com', and in other Catholic publications as deemed appropriate.
8. The Catholic Foundation places no restriction on Foundation Scholarship applicants as to the number of other scholarships that he/she may hold simultaneously. However, the Catholic Foundation cannot and does not purport to speak for other scholarship providers in this matter and the conditions that may be attached to their particular scholarship/s awards. The onus therefore rests with each Catholic Foundation Scholarship applicant to be familiar with the application requirements of other scholarship providers when such applications are being planned.
9. Foundation Scholarship applications must be with your College Rector/Principal/Dean of Senior Studies, or Parish Priest no later than Wednesday 9th October 2008 and be received by mail to the Catholic Foundation P O Box 1937, Wellington by Wednesday 16th October 2008. Late applications will NOT be accepted.
